A FEW OF THE HIRERS' SKIING RULES AT THE DAM Please show this to your crew

Only two boats to be IN the water at any time. This means one boat must pull out before its replacement can be launched.

Boats are to operate in an anti-clockwise direction.

The driver and observer should check for swimmers and paddlers before leaving the shore. You should ask them to return to the swimming area.

Both the boat and the skier(s) must remain completely within the marked ski area at all times.

First boat in is the last boat out. If they are keen enough to be early they get any extra ski time.

First boat (not crew) to arrive has choice of ski beach.

Generally, one boat only on each of the beaches.

Skiing to be only from the two beaches adjacent to the ramp, one to the north & one to the south.

Morning skiers should leave the beach and area within a reasonable time.

Be aware that we are on show at the dam and alcohol consumption, particularly in the boat, is very conspicuous.

A legal observer must be used; if between 12 & 16 years old they must have a "Young Adult Licence" and it should be available for showing.

No skiing before or after the day's start and finish times.

The start time of the afternoon session is their start time, not the time to begin pulling out the morning session boats. If the afternoon boat(s) are in attendance they should be allowed to start on time. Last boat to arrive for morning session should be aware that two boats may have to come out prior to changeover time.

There are no bins; take your rubbish home or to the bins by the change rooms.

All ski sessions used must be hired and paid for and receipt must be available to show a Ranger or Club Member if asked.

The Club must have copies of up to date registration, insurance and licences or the boat is not to be used on the dam. Be aware of your crew's licences.

Dragging ropes can damage the slalom course and jump; be aware of where your rope is when in or near the slalom course and jump.

Be aware of your crew's parking; don't block the thoroughfare; use the upper carpark if necessary, it's only a short walk.

Park your trailer clear of the water; it's a danger to skiers and walkers may like to walk behind it.

When launching your boat make a point to have someone at the rear to watch for children and others.

The "60" signs by the launching ramp and on the opposite side of the dam indicate 60 metres from the swimming area. When swimmers are at the area markers that is the "distance off" turning indicator.

Some modern boat stereos can be very loud. Please keep them at a level so as not to annoy or interfere with other users of the area.
